CLINICAL WORK

- Different organizations will have different protocols.

 Some are continuing as usual, some are not...
- Adjust your expectations
- Especially during the pandemic, there is a need for telehealth and psychological support!
- MORE opportunities with crisis and support hotlines!
- Remember to take care of yourself!!

- ☐ Reach out to potential lab supervisors and/or lab managers.
- ☐ Bring interest, passion, and new ideas to the table.
- ☐ Contribute as much as possible, while knowing your limits.

Clinical Work:

Clinical Research: In developing research experience, you may find great opportunities for clinical experience. For example, you might screen participants for eligibility over the phone, conduct semi-structured interviews, or interact with vulnerable populations in different ways.

Active Listening and Crisis Hotlines: Active listening is about providing a warm, non-judgemental, empathetic, and authentic ear to an individual in need. Crisis lines aim to provide support to individuals affected by a crisis, either personally, or through someone they know and care for.

Community Involvement: Think about any social injustice or inequality - there is probably a volunteering opportunity for that!

Mentoring: Meeting 1-on-1 with vulnerable members of the community to support their autonomy, well-being, or re-integration, and reduce stigmatization and distress.

Teaching: Working or volunteering with individuals to support their academic achievement. Ex. tutoring There are many many many opportunities...
